## NEAT STRINGS

Doris & Franz Rosenberger have been collecting violin, bass and guitar strings from nationally and internationally well-known musicians. Together with a personal dedication they have received the strings from the artists at concerts and music events.

Doris & Franz have made every single string into an individual piece of jewelry with a unique musical past. Each piece is a unique specimen and not for sale. In the years to come they can be seen on a traveling exposition in order to present them to an interested public.

Doris & Franz Rosenberger have collected strings from more than 130 musicians from Jazz, Rock, Folk, Blues and Classical music. Each string is being made into necklaces, bangles, brooches, rings and pendants.
